
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Session 1

The Searcing

Internal Consistency

Psalm 23 — "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want."

Ezekiel 34 — God removes the worthless shepherds and declares, "I myself will tend my sheep and have them lie down, declares the Sovereign LORD.... (and) I will place over them one shepherd, my servant David, and he will tend them; he will tend them and be their shepherd."

The Fig Tree

Matthew 21:18-20:

Seeing a fig tree by the road, he went up to it but found nothing on it except leaves. Then he said to it, "May you never bear fruit again!" <u>Immediately the tree withered.</u> When the disciples saw this, they were amazed. "How did the fig tree wither so quickly?" they asked.

Mark 11:13-14, 20-21

When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs. Then he said to the tree, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." And his disciples heard him say it. In the morning, as they went along, they saw the fig tree withered from the roots. Peter remembered and said to Jesus, "Rabbi, look! The fig tree you cursed has withered!"

To Fear or Not to Fear

Psalm 111:10 — The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom (23x as something desirable)

1 John 4:16-18 — And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love... There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.

Romans 8:15 — "For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father."

The New Testament Fear Factor

Luke 12:5 — "Fear him who, after the killing of the body, has power to throw you into hell."

Acts 5 — Ananias and Sapphira

2 Cor 5:11 — "Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord, we try to persuade men."

Phil 2:12 — "...continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling... for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose..."

Rev. 14:7 "Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come.

The Old Testament Focus on Love

- "The LORD is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love." Psalms and others.
- "Do not be afraid" When God/angel appears
- Deut 6 fufillment of law: Love God and neighbor
- Lovingkindness (184 x in NAS)
- Use of love with God 100s of times
- "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22-23

Why We're Not Emergent, by Kevin DeYoung

Why we need the doctrine of eternal punishment and the wrath of God:

- First, we need God's wrath to keep us honest about evangelism. (Acts 24:25).
- Second, we need God's wrath in order to forgive our enemies. (Rom. 12:19).
- Third, we need God's wrath in order to risk our lives for Jesus. (Rev. 6:10).
- Fourth, we need God's wrath in order to live holy lives.
 (Gal. 6:6-7).

- Fifth, we need God's wrath in order to understand mercy. (Eph. 2:3, Rom 5:10).
- Sixth, we need God's wrath in order to grasp how wonderful heaven will be.
- Seventh, we need the wrath of God in order to be motivated to care for the poor. (Matt. 25:31-46)
- Eighth, we need God's wrath (to keep alert) for the Lord's return.

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What I am saying is that as long as the heir is a child, he is no different from a slave, although he owns the whole estate. He is subject to guardians and trustees until the time set by his father. So also, when we were children, we were in slavery under the basic principles of the world. But when the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons. Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father." So you are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, God has made you also an heir.

Revelational Flow of Scripture

Sacrifices, Offerings & Tithes

- → None for Abraham (unilateral covenant)
- → Added through the law of Moses
- → David sees through them (Psalm 51:17)
- → Isaiah rejects them (1:11)
- → Malachi said to withhold the tithe is to cheat God
- → Jesus becomes the sacrifice we need (Hebrews)
- → Early believers gave to God out of generosity (2 Cor 7-9)

Generational Curses

- → God punishes children for the sin of the fathers (Exodus 20:5)
- → David curses the children of a wicked man (Psalm 109:9-10)
- → The son will not share the guilt of the father, nor will the father the guilt of the son (Ezekiel 18:2-4)
- → Jesus, "Whoever Believes... (John 3:16)

Executing the Law

- → Put to death those who commit adultery (Leviticus 20:10)
- → Jesus says to adulteress, "Then neither do I condemn you." (John 8:11)



The Story of Redemption

- 1. God created a world for us to enjoy him

 - Faithful even in our faithlessness.
 - Holds sin in check until until Redeemer comes



- 4. Incarnation God appears in the creation to show us what he's like and to redeem the broken world.
- 5. Believers explore that relationship and its resulting transformation
- 6. Hints of the end where the created order is restored in a new heaven and new earth, a pure, undefiled eternity.



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
Session 4

The Jesus

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"He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Reading Scripture As A Story

- → Read the Middle Letters (Ephesians Philippians, Colossians, Philemon, Hebrews)
- → Read the Late Letters & Revelation (Timothy, Titus, Peter, Jude, John)
- → Then look for how the Old Testament ushered us into that reality.

- 3. My conversations with other followers, including reading books past and present


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Session 5


